Rules of Improv in the classroom

1) Play.



2) Let yourself fail.



3) Listen (really, really listen).




4) Say « Yes ».



5) Say « Yes, and ».




6) Play the game.



7) Relax and have fun.



Non-verbal warmers



Non-verbal warmer demonstration: « Beat that rhythm »

- Increased observation
- Non-verbal cues
- Break from « the before »
- Set [learners] free from the crippling concern for correct speech, »
 (McNeece, 1983)
- Ease into spontaneity



Verbal warmers



Using lines of dialogue (for open offers):

Student 1 chooses ONE line of dialogue, decides how to deliver it and says the line. Student 2 listens & responds appropriately.

Teacher calls « STOP! » after 2-3 exchanges—it's just a warmer!

Sample first lines:

- I need help.
- I have something for you.
- I'm here.
- Here you go.
- Don't try to fool me.
- This must be the place.

- Who are you?
- Are you sure?
- What can I do for you?
- What is this?
- Can I talk to you for a minute?
- Shall we get started?



- 3. A word (suitable for the context)


Demonstration:

- Support tasks as much / as little as needed
- Doesn't overwhelm
- Set limits that allow Ss freedom to focus
- Let Ss take responsibility for developing scenes


